PLANNING WATER FACILITY UPGRADES

Our aging water supply system is nearing its capacity to reliably meet the community's current and future water demand. Conservation is critical, but it won't be enough to ensure our water future.

That's one of the reasons why the Lake Oswego-Tigard Water Partnership project is designing facility improvements including a new water intake on the Clackamas River, a water treatment plant in West Linn, a new Waluga reservoir, and new pipelines in between.

Lake Oswego and Tigard are partnering to keep costs lower for both communities. The project team has begun meeting with neighbors around current and future facilities to make sure their input is considered in the plans.
