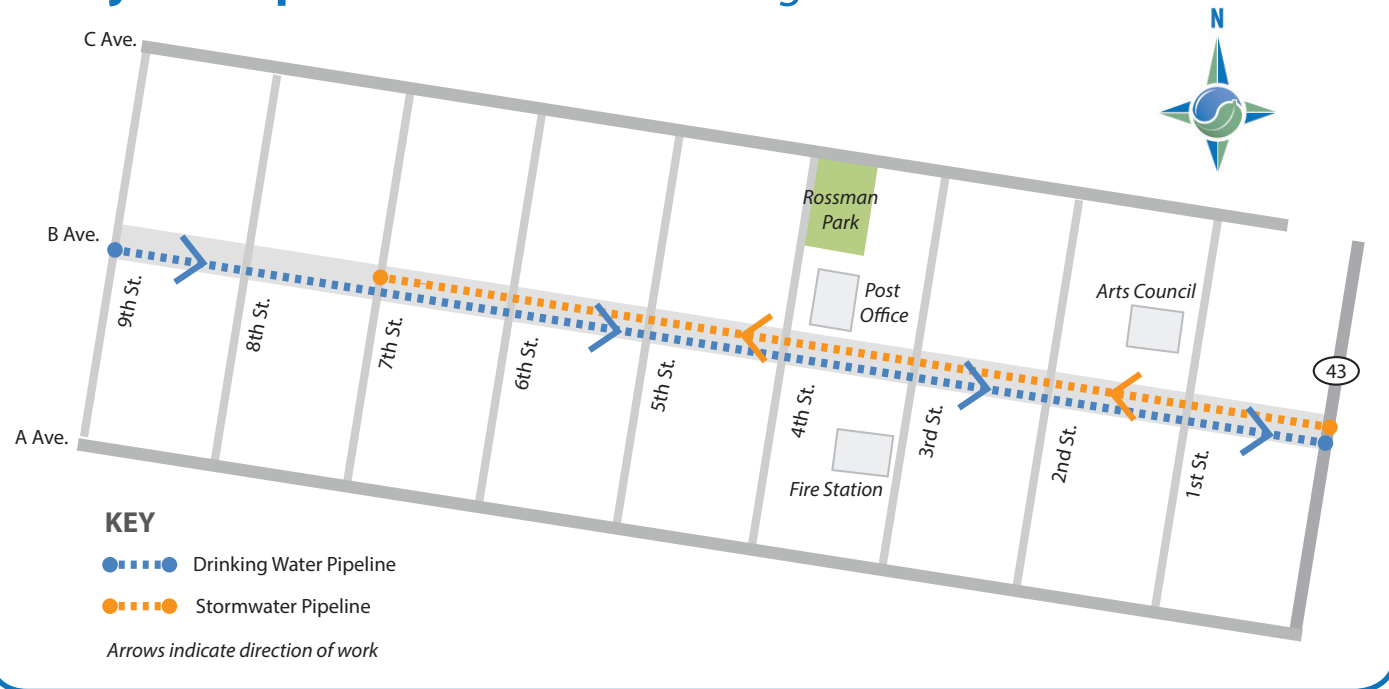


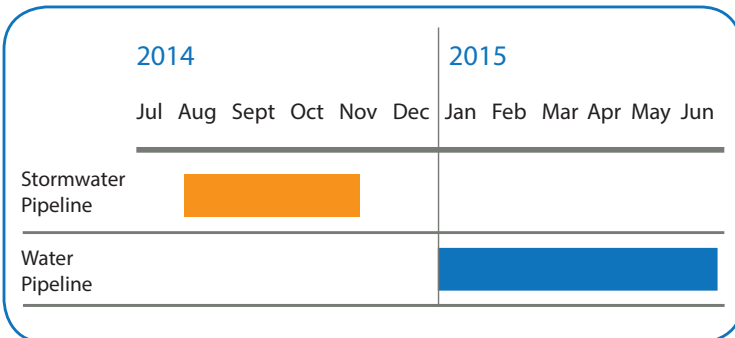
What can Neighbors Expect?

Shop Downtown Lake Oswego! We're open during construction.

B Avenue may be busy with construction, but businesses are still open. Public and on-street parking will be available in all areas downtown outside each one-block work zone.



Upcoming Construction on Two Water Projects

This summer, construction on two separate water projects will begin on B Avenue in downtown Lake Oswego. This work will include a stormwater system upgrade to prevent flooding and a new water pipeline for the Lake Oswego and Tigard water system.

Key Information

- Construction work will occur Monday–Friday, 7 a.m. to 6 p.m. (City-approved construction hours).
- Only one block and one intersection of B Avenue will be closed to traffic at a time, and a detour will be in place.
- Pedestrian access to all businesses will be maintained.
- There will be no parking on either side of B Avenue in the one-block work zone.

B Ave. Stormwater System Upgrade

Pipelines that carry stormwater from Lake Oswego's northeastern neighborhoods to Tryon Creek are up to 100 years old and undersized. Flooding has been an issue for some neighbors and businesses.

- This work is scheduled to start mid to early August and is anticipated to take three to four months to complete.
- Work will begin at State Street and B Avenue, working west one block at a time.

B Ave. Water Pipeline Construction

Lake Oswego's water supply system is near capacity, and key facilities require expansion and upgrades. Lake Oswego and Tigard have created a partnership to share drinking water resources and costs. Our new water system will provide reliable, consistently high-quality drinking water—all for less than a penny per gallon.

The new pipeline will deliver drinking water to homes and businesses in Lake Oswego and Tigard starting in 2016.

- Waterline construction is scheduled to begin in early 2015. This work will take about six months to complete.
- Work will begin at 9th St. and B Ave. Pipeline will be installed one block at a time, working east, toward State Street.
